

## Lesson: Where do clouds come from?

---

<b>boil</b>	to heat a liquid until it bubbles and turns quickly into a gas
<b>cloud</b>	a collection of tiny water droplets that are visible in the air
<b>condensation</b>	the process of a gas changing to a liquid
<b>evaporation</b>	the process of a liquid changing to a gas
<b>experiment</b>	a test used to discover new information about a question
<b>fog</b>	a cloud near the ground
<b>gas</b>	a state of matter, such as water when it is steam
<b>liquid</b>	a state of matter, such as water when you can pour it
<b>matter</b>	anything that takes up space; can be in different forms such as solid, liquid, or gas
<b>melt</b>	when a solid turns into a liquid, such as when ice melts into water
<b>observe</b>	to pay close attention to something
<b>rain</b>	water drops that fall from clouds
<b>solid</b>	a state of matter, such as water when it is frozen ice
<b>states of matter</b>	different forms of matter that include solid, liquid, and gas
<b>water vapor</b>	water when it is a gas, such as steam
