| <b>claim</b>     | to say or write an idea   |
| <b>desert</b>    | a habitat that is usually hot and that gets very little rain  |
| <b>evidence</b>  | information that can be used to support or reject an idea   |
| <b>forest</b>    | a habitat with lots of trees  |
| <b>fossil</b>    | the remains of a plant or animal that lived a very, very long time ago  |
| <b>grassland</b> | a habitat with mostly grasses and very few trees  |
| <b>habitat</b>   | the place where an animal or plant lives  |
| <b>model</b>     | a pretend version of something that scientists use when the real thing is too big, small, or complicated to work with |
| <b>observe</b>   | to pay close attention to something   |
| <b>ocean</b>     | a large area of salt water that covers the Earth  |
| <b>polar</b>     | a habitat that is very cold   |
| <b>quarry</b>    | a large, deep pit that people remove rock from  |
| <b>trait</b>     | something you can observe about a living thing, such as the broad fins of a fish                                      |
