

## Lesson: Why do seeds have so many different shapes?

---

<b>animal dispersal</b>	when an animal moves a seed from one place to another
<b>disperse</b>	to move and spread out
<b>model</b>	a pretend version of something that scientists use when the real thing is too big, small, or complicated to work with
<b>pattern</b>	something that happens again and again and again in a way that can be predicted
<b>seed</b>	a part of a plant that can grow into a baby plant
<b>structure</b>	the specific form and shape of something
<b>survive</b>	to stay alive
