

## Lesson: Where's the best place to hide a treasure?

---

<b>canyon</b>	a deep hole in the ground formed over a long time by moving water
<b>cliff</b>	a high area of land with a side that is almost straight up and down
<b>compass star (compass rose)</b>	a drawing on a map that points to the four main directions (north, south, east, west)
<b>east</b>	one of four main directions; if you are facing north, it is to the right
<b>feature</b>	an important part of a place or thing
<b>hill</b>	a high area of land that isn't as tall as a mountain
<b>island</b>	land with water all around it
<b>lake</b>	a large area of water with land all around it
<b>landform</b>	a natural structure of Earth's surface, like a mountain or canyon
<b>map</b>	a picture that shows the features of a place and where those features are
<b>mesa</b>	a high area of land with a flat top and sides that are almost straight up and down
<b>model</b>	a pretend version of something that scientists use when the real thing is too big, small, or complicated to work with
<b>mountain</b>	a high area of land with steep sides
<b>north</b>	one of four main directions; when you face north, west is to the left and east is to the right
<b>ocean</b>	a large area of salt water that covers the Earth
<b>plains</b>	large areas of flat land with few trees

## Lesson: Where's the best place to hide a treasure?

---

<b>pond</b>	an area of still water, larger than a puddle but smaller than a lake
<b>river</b>	a long, thin area of water that flows
<b>south</b>	one of four main directions; if you are facing north, it is behind you
<b>valley</b>	a low area of land between hills or mountains
<b>waterfall</b>	flowing water that falls from a tall place
<b>west</b>	one of four main directions; if you are facing north, it is to the left
