

## Lesson: Why do plants grow flowers?

---

<b>flower</b>	the reproductive part of some plants that can make seeds
<b>model</b>	a pretend version of something that scientists use when the real thing is too big, small, or complicated to work with
<b>nectar</b>	a sugary liquid that plants make
<b>offspring</b>	babies
<b>pollen</b>	a powder plants make that is involved in plant reproduction
<b>pollination</b>	the process of moving pollen from one part of a flower (the stamen) to another part of a flower (the stigma)
<b>reproduction</b>	a stage in the life cycle of living things when they have offspring
<b>seed</b>	a part of a plant that can grow into a baby plant
<b>stamen</b>	the part of a flower that has pollen
<b>stigma</b>	the sticky part of a flower that pollen can stick to
