

## Lesson: Why do birds have beaks?

---

<b>beak</b>	the part of a bird that it uses to eat
<b>experiment</b>	a test used to discover new information about a question
<b>food</b>	something that animals eat
<b>function</b>	what something does
<b>model</b>	a pretend version of something that scientists use when the real thing is too big, small, or complicated to work with
<b>mouth</b>	the opening animals use to take in food and water
<b>needs</b>	something an animal or plant must have in order to live
<b>shape</b>	how something looks, such as circle, square, or triangle
<b>size</b>	how big or small something is
<b>stomach</b>	a part of the body where food goes after being eaten
<b>structure</b>	the specific form and shape of something
<b>survive</b>	to stay alive
<b>tongue</b>	a part of the body, inside the mouth, used for taste
