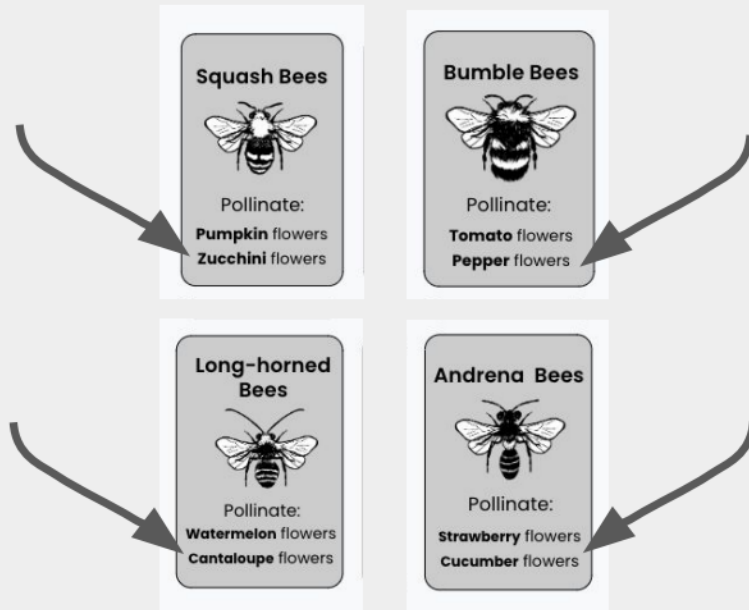


# Game Extension
