

## Lesson: If you floated down a river, where would you end up?

---

<b>experiment</b>	a test used to discover new information about a question
<b>float</b>	to rest on top of water without sinking
<b>flow</b>	to move along
<b>forest</b>	a place with lots of trees
<b>hill</b>	a high area of land that isn't as tall as a mountain
<b>lake</b>	a large area of water with land all around it
<b>map</b>	a drawing of a place that shows where things are
<b>model</b>	a pretend version of something that scientists use when the real thing is too big, small, or complicated to work with
<b>mountain</b>	a high area of land with steep sides
<b>ocean</b>	a large area of salt water that covers the Earth
<b>pattern</b>	something that happens again and again and again in a way that can be predicted
<b>plains</b>	large areas of flat land with few trees
<b>pond</b>	an area of still water, larger than a puddle, but smaller than a lake
<b>rain</b>	water drops that fall from clouds
<b>river</b>	a long, thin area of water that flows
<b>stream</b>	a small river
