See how it's munching on those eucalyptus leaves? Koalas eat lots and lots of those leaves, and it's totally fine. But eucalyptus leaves are poisonous to other animals like deer and foxes. Oh, and check out this opossum. They can eat venomous rattlesnakes and pit vipers without getting hurt. Woah. And then there's humans. We eat lots of chocolate, but dogs can't. They shouldn't eat chocolate at all, not even a little. Poor dogs. You might have wondered why that is. Let's try and figure this out. This is the inside of a dog's body, and this is its heart. This is how a dog's heart beats normally. Now let's take a look at what happens when a dog eats chocolate. Notice anything? Yep. When a dog eats chocolate, it can make its heart beat faster than it normally should. And that's not all. Chocolate makes other parts of its body have to work harder too, which isn't good.
