

## Lesson: Where do animals find the water they need?

---

<b>Arctic</b>	area around the North Pole that is very cold
<b>body of water</b>	an area of water, such as a lake, pond, or ocean
<b>freeze</b>	when a liquid turns to solid, like when liquid water freezes to solid ice
<b>ice</b>	water when it is a frozen solid
<b>lake</b>	a large area of water with land all around it
<b>liquid</b>	a state of matter, such as water when you can pour it
<b>matter</b>	anything that takes up space; can be in different forms such as solid, liquid, or gas
<b>melt</b>	when a solid turns to liquid, like when solid ice melts to liquid water
<b>observe</b>	to pay close attention to something
<b>ocean</b>	a large area of salt water that covers the Earth
<b>pond</b>	an area of still water, larger than a puddle, but smaller than a lake
<b>river</b>	a long, thin area of water that flows
<b>snow</b>	solid water that falls from the sky when it's very cold outside
<b>solid</b>	a state of matter, such as water when it is frozen ice
<b>states of matter</b>	the different forms of matter that include solid, liquid, and gas
<b>stream</b>	a small river
<b>waterfall</b>	flowing water that falls from a tall place
